Sentosa Recognised as One of the World's Leading Sustainable Tourism Destinations

SINGAPORE, **22 MARCH 2013** – Sentosa has been recognised as one of the world's leading sustainable tourism destinations. The island resort has been selected from 130 odd applicants across some 50 countries as a finalist for the prestigious Tourism for Tomorrow Awards' (TTA) *Destination Stewardship Award*, organised by the World Travel & Tourism Council (WTTC).

The *Destination Stewardship Award* recognises visitor attractions which have successfully implemented a sustainable tourism programme at the destination level, incorporating social, cultural, environmental and economic benefits as well as multi-stakeholder engagement. Shortlisted attractions are judged on their ability in best demonstrating the protection of natural and cultural heritage, delivering social and economic benefits to local people, and engaging in environmentally-friendly operations.

The other finalists for the Destination Stewardship Award are the Tourism Council of Bhutan and The Peaks of the Balkans in Kosovo. The winner will be announced during the TTA awards ceremony in Abu Dhabi on 9 April.

"Sentosa is delighted and honoured to be selected as a finalist for this prestigious award", said Mike Barclay, Chief Executive Officer of Sentosa Development Corporation. "The award is testament to the successful collective commitment of our island partners and employees to develop an attractive tourist destination, while conserving and enhancing the island's heritage areas and environment at the same time. On Sentosa Island, we seek to balance the needs of the environment and the island's tourism potential in a socially responsible manner. This

approach is in line with Singapore's national development vision to strike a delicate balance between development and conservation.

"We recognise that our special blend of development-cum-conservation is a unique value proposition for our guests and residents, which underpins and drives Sentosa's continued success. As such, safeguarding our greenery and heritage has always been in our DNA. We will continue to put a high priority on sustainability initiatives as we continue to enhance Sentosa's tourism potential."

Despite major developments and high visitorship¹ on Sentosa island over the years, deliberate steps have been taken to preserve the island's rich heritage and natural charm. The island's ecological efforts are reflected in its meticulous land planning and usage, as well as Sentosa's island operations. On the heritage front, colonial buildings and even former monorail stations have been conserved and given new leases of life through innovative design for commercial and recreational use. Measures have also been taken to reduce vehicular traffic on the island, helping to reduce noise and carbon emissions from vehicles, in order to preserve the island's charm and tranquility. Today, almost 50% of Sentosa is covered with vegetation, while development is contained to just 40% of the island.

The Tourism Travel Awards ceremony will coincide with the WTTC Global Summit to be held in Abu Dhabi, UAE on April 9-10. Comprising four categories, the TTA represents one of the highest accolades in the global travel and tourism industry. The other Award categories are for Global Tourism Business, Conservation and Community Benefit.
