Sentosa Golf Club sponsors three local amateurs

Singapore, 5 May 2015 – Sentosa Golf Club is sponsoring three local amateur golfers in a year-long programme to provide them a training ground at Singapore’s number one golf course, The Serapong, which is in tournament conditions daily. It is the first club in Singapore to offer such a programme to three amateurs.

Sentosa Golf Club has been sponsoring female amateur Koh Sock Hwee since 2013 which has been extended another year, and have added two more local amateurs. The three amateurs, Koh Sock Wee, 26, Jen Goh, 20 and Dane Ang, 17 were nominated by the Singapore Golf Association, and will have complimentary access to and use of the Sentosa Golf Club’s golfing facilities in 2015.

Low Teo Ping, President, Sentosa Golf Club shared, “Sentosa Golf Club commemorated its 40th anniversary last year, and we felt that this sponsorship is a great opportunity to renew our commitment to not only deliver a world-class golfing experience, but to also open our course for Singapore’s young talents. We aim to nurture their golfing skills and also help them realise their ambition to bring glory to our nation”.

It will be the competition grounds for the 28th SEA Games 2015 golf event as well as the Singapore Open when it returns in January 2016.
