Survival tips for Southeast Asia's first Pokémon GO Safari Zone at Sentosa

Plus, enjoy free Pokémon experiences featuring world's first 6-metre-tall Lapras inflatable, fun meet & greet sessions, photo points and more!

Singapore – 8 April 2019 – Southeast Asia's first-ever Pokémon GO Safari Zone event will see Pokémon, online and offline, taking over Sentosa from 18 to 22 April 2019!

Not only can Safari Zone ticket-holders look forward to catching rare Pokémon like Unown, and a shiny Shuckle too if you are lucky, through the Pokémon GO app, all guests in Sentosa will also enjoy exclusive Pokémon experiences over the long weekend!

- Check out the world's first 6-metre-tall Lapras inflatable at Palawan Beach, amongst Pokémon photo points spanning the Sentosa Boardwalk to Tanjong Beach!
- Get up close to Pikachu in adorable costumes at free meet-and-greet sessions daily at Palawan Beach and Tanjong Beach! There will be three sessions at 11.30am, 2.30pm and 4pm every day during the event period.
- Bring home official Pokémon plushies from the Pokémon pop-up store at Palawan Green.

Plus, swap tips, trade Pokémon, and take a break at the Players Lounges along Palawan and Tanjong Beach! Themed in the colours of the three teams – Mystic, Valor, and Instinct – the Players Lounges are spaces where Trainers can cool off, refuel and get together under the shade.

Those feeling peckish can also look forward to a selection of light bites at food carts located at Palawan Green, Palawan Beach and Tanjong Beach.

How ticket-holders can check into the event

Trainers who received their confirmation email for the event earlier will receive a unique QR code in their email inbox on 12 April 2019. This QR code serves as the free ticket to Pokémon GO Safari Zone, Sentosa™, and will be required for check-in via the Pokémon GO app during the event. The QR code will only work once – on the pre-selected date Trainers had submitted during the ballot.

To check into the event, Pokémon GO Safari Zone, Sentosa™ participants are advised to print out their QR codes and head to either one of two virtual check-in PokéStops, located at Resorts World Sentosa and Palawan Green, before kick-starting their Pokémon GO adventure.

Trainers need not worry about missing the check-in area, as the location will be visible in the Pokémon GO app itself. At the check-in PokéStop, simply scan the printed QR code using the Pokémon GO app, and head off once the check-in process is completed.

How to get to the check-in PokéStops



Trainers and Pokémon fans are strongly encouraged to go car-light and enter the island via public transport due to limited parking space. Easily access the check-in PokéStops at Resorts World Sentosa and Palawan Green via multiple modes of entry:

Free modes of entry:

- Stroll in: From VivoCity, stroll across the Sentosa Boardwalk and straight to the first PokéStop at Resorts World Sentosa for free. Take this route into the island for the full event experience!
- SBS Transit's Bus 123: Entering the island via SBS Transit's Service 123 takes you directly to Sentosa's Beach Station bus terminal, a short walk to the check-in PokéStop at Palawan Green. Guests entering via Service 123 need only pay the prevailing distance-based bus fare, as no island admission fees apply.

Other modes of entry:

- Sentosa Express: Hop on the Sentosa Express at VivoCity to get to either one of the check-in PokéStops! Alight after one stop at the Resorts World Station, or three stops later at Beach Station to check in at Palawan Green.



- Driving in: For those who still wish to drive in, there are parking facilities available across the island. Do note that once the car parks along the beach are filled, cars will be directed to park at Sentosa Cove Village. A dedicated free shuttle bus service between Sentosa Cove Village and Beach Station will be available from 9.30am to 9.30pm daily.

At the end of the adventure, guests may exit via the same way or catch the free shuttle bus from Beach Station to Harbourfront Interchange, which will be available from 6pm to 10pm on Thursday and Monday, as well as from 4pm to 10pm from Friday to Sunday during the event period.
